Summer Time Is Moving Time

We're starting to see dumping of furniture, mattress and other items on city streets and planting strips...Some folks have NO PRIDE at all in keeping our city clean. Be alert and keep your eyes open. Get license plate numbers or take a photo and send it to the San Mateo Police Dept. Don't forget we are allowed two large trash pickups yearly as residential customers of Recology. Use these pickups to help you dump unwanted items, which includes one large item (appliances or mattress set) for each pick-up and the equivalent of 12 plastic bags. If you have wood, they should be cut in pieces 6 ft. or shorter. Short loose boards should be bundled to make it easier for pickup. Call ahead and make an appointment to schedule your big trash pickup.

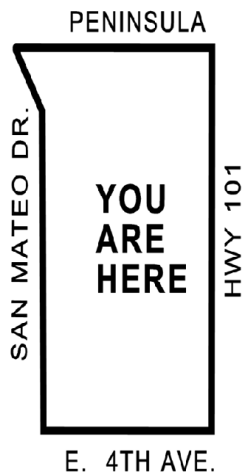
The other problem which can leave trash on our streets during garbage pick-up days is people who over-fill their garbage and recycling bins so the lids will not close. When that automatic arm picks up a bin, the overflowing items can fall out of the bin and onto the street. If you have too much trash for your garbage bin, maybe you need to order a larger size or an extra bin.

In the meantime the money allotted is diminishing as cost of construction keeps rising due to the "inaction" by the High School District Trustees. Peninsula Interchange Project

Over 130 community members attended a Project Update meeting on June 25, 2015 hosted by City of San Mateo Public Works Department on the possible development of US 101 southbound on and off ramps to Peninsula Avenue. A slide presentation was given regarding the project along with several consultants from AECOM, the consultants hired to do the study by SMCTA. Two alternatives are being considered. Preliminary costs below include construction, eminent domain costs and relocation of utilities costs.

Alternative 1 – Tight Diamond: Preliminary costs of \$56,300,000.

Alternative 2 – Partially Spread Diamond: Preliminary costs of \$70,800,000.

Both alternatives require significant eminent domain of up to 25 commercial properties on No. Amphlett north of Peninsula and Alternative 2 will also require, in addition to the commercial properties, a large apartment building at the corner of Peninsula and No. Amphlett.

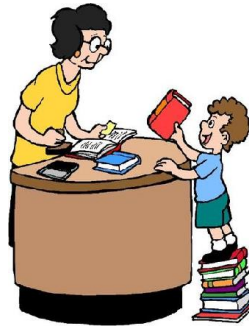
